Let's look at some of the reasons Anchor Bay is such a draw. Of course, it's part of north Lake St. Clair and is situated perfectly to take advantage of the currents and flows that travel southward from the St. Clair River, and split into the North Channel, Middle Channel, Shipping Channel – and the many smaller tributaries in between. That means our waters are well circulated and warm more quickly than those near the Islands, where temperatures can be as much as ten degrees cooler.

Anchor Bay is the perfect playground. In fact, the pristine, sandy and clear anchorages of Anchor Bay where we swim and play are literally a stone's throw away. But what keeps the water so pristine, while we sometimes hear about beaches further south being closed after heavy rains? Well, the Bay is north of the Clinton River, a major waterway which carries the flowages from the "12 Town Drains" upstream. Water that flows out of the Clinton River into the lake naturally flow south, leaving waters north (i.e., Anchor Bay) unaffected by any contamination.

In this rich and clean environment, it shouldn't be surprising that wildlife abounds. And it does so above and below the waters of Anchor Bay. Sea birds of all shapes and sizes – from mallards to hawks to Arctic Terns thousands of miles from home – travel over or spend some time here. And the fishing is legendary. The lake in general and Anchor Bay in particular is, in fact, one of the finest fisheries in the world for smallmouth bass and muskellunge. And we haven't even mentioned walleye, perch, largemouth bass, catfish, pike, rock bass – and dozens of other species.

Another major advantage Anchor Bay boaters have is their proximity to things to see, things to do – and places to eat. As most of us know, we are close to many restaurants that can easily be reached by boat. We're also close to the North Channel and can access the St. Clair River and Lake Huron with relative ease.

Anchor Bay is also home to all the popular boating destinations such as the Islands, St. Clair Flats and Metropolitan Beach – worth a trip in itself for its Olympic swimming, expansive beaches, nature trails, miniature and par 3 golf, and marina accommodations.

So no matter how and when you play on or in Anchor Bay, remember what a treasure it is. It's a great resource and destination; something we all should savor and appreciate!

More Improvements Welcome BMH Boaters Back This Spring

Belle Maer's boating family understands that the "off season" applies mostly to boaters – certainly not to the harbormaster, yard workers and contractors who are hired to make the myriad of improvements that greet us in the Spring.

Well, the Spring of '08 is no exception as numerous improvements will welcome one and all back to the marina.

A substantial section of sea wall was replaced on Griffon (G Row) from Well Numbers 267-315 – and re-doing the landscaping, sidewalks, electric, water, sod, repaving and everything else. G Row will also get new, state-of-the-art utility pedestals.

Improvements include the planting of new trees on B Row; the trees that were originally planted in containers did not thrive, and were replaced with crimson maples – the same variety as we have throughout the marina.

Exterior painting progressed on other buildings and enclosures, including Building #2 (Service Building), Building #6, and enclosures around dumpsters and other areas. Eric pledges that yard workers will continue working on remaining structures until each building is converted over to the new color scheme.

Improvements include repairing the gazebo structures, and replacing the gazebo roofs where needed. New roofs are constructed from a more rugged shingle material to make them more attractive, functional and durable.

Belle Maer transient prices have been set at \$1.50 per linear foot per night. Check out time is 11:00 am on the next day. Anyone wishing to stay past the check out time on the next day will be required to pay for an additional night.

Belle Maer also offers special rates to our boating customers:

Rack customers can spend an evening in the water by renting a transient well for \$.75 per linear foot.

All of our customers can sponsor an individual friend or family member to spend an evening for \$1.00 per linear foot.

All rates are doubled for the fireworks show on the 4th of July.

Transient guests must pay in advance. It is preferred that payment be made one week in advance by check. Any payments less than a week in advance must be made in cash (no credit cards). The use of the swimming pool and all of the other marina amenities are included in the daily transient fee.

How to Get The Most From a Tank of Gas

Boat Owners Association of The United States (BoatU.S.) has a few tips that could significantly reduce your fuel costs.



1. Leave the extra 'junk' home: Don't load the boat up with weight you don't need. Do a little spring cleaning - unused equipment that has been collecting mildew in the bottom of lockers for years should be taken home.
2. Water weight: This isn't about your mother's diet. At 8.33 pounds per gallon, why keep the water in the tank topped off if you're only going out for the afternoon?
3. Tune her up: An engine with fouled plugs, dirty air filter, erratic timing, a sputtering carburetor, or weak compression will gobble up fuel and perform dismally. The bottom line: A tune-up is an excellent investment and could easily pay for itself over the summer.
4. Tune your prop: You can lose up to 5 mph of boat speed with a poorly tuned prop. If your boat goes 50 mph with a like-new prop and only 45 mph with a prop that's dinged and out of pitch, you've lost 10% of your speed but are still using the same amount of fuel. That converts to a 10% loss in fuel economy.
5. Clean the boat's bottom: A fouled bottom is like a dull knife; it takes a lot more effort – fuel – to push it through the water. Barnacles and slime slow the boat dramatically and increase fuel consumption.
6. Keep the boat in trim: Either by using trim tabs or with weight distribution. A boat that is trimmed correctly will move through the water with less effort – and less fuel.
7. Install a fuel flow meter: A fuel flow meter is like a heart monitor; when consumption starts to rise, it's an early warning that something is amiss. A fuel flow meter also allows you to select a comfortable cruising speed that optimizes the amount of fuel being consumed. If you don't want to spring for a fuel flow meter (about \$300), you can calculate your fuel mileage by dividing distance traveled by gallons at fill-up. Using your logbook, you can then approximate fuel flow using average speeds and time underway.
8. For sailboats only: If you own a sailboat, all of the above apply, but the real savings begin when the engine is shut off and the sails are raised.
9. Get a discount: Many of the 750 BoatU.S. Cooperating Marinas around the country offer up to 10 cents off a gallon of gas. To get the discount all you have to do is to show your BoatU.S. membership card. 10. Pass the Hat: Stand up comic and BoatU.S. Magazine humor columnist Cap'n Drew has this sage advice: "You can always drop anchor just outside the gas dock, and sit there staring at the pump, sighing wistfully. Your guests will get the hint."

50th Annual Detroit Boat Show Opens February 16th

The Detroit Boat Show is celebrating 50 years of boating with its 2008 event. The Detroit Boat Show started in 1958 and shares birthdays with Alan Jackson, Madonna, and Wade Boggs. It was a year when other great things happened like the launch of the first U.S. Satellite and the opening of the Air Force Academy. Many exciting things have happened through the 50 years of the show and many exciting things are planned for this year's event.

The 2008 Boat Show will feature 500,000 square feet of exhibition space dedicated to this favorite recreational activity. Visitors will see more than 1,000 boats from 10 feet to 48 feet in length. There will be boats for fishing, skiing, cruising, sailing, pontooning and everything in between.

50 Year Anniversary Exhibit - A Walk Back in Time.

Rare footage of the launching of the Edmond Fitzgerald on the Detroit River in 1958 shows an armada of boaters watching from the Detroit River. The boats, however, are vastly different from the state-of-the-art vessels we enjoy today. In this display, the incredible transformation of boats from 1958 through 2008 is documented in a unique timeline that takes us through the 60s and into the future. On display will be many boats and automobiles from the 1950s, including a 1958 Curley Craft built by Northwestern Boat Company, which is still in existence on West 10 Mile Road in Southfield. In addition to boats and motors, memorabilia including catalogues, magazines, life jackets, water skis, fishing equipment, and electronics will be on display. The exhibit takes care to note historical, pop culture, and nautical events having both general and specific appeal for all who take the time to experience it.

Innespace Dolphin Concept Boat Comes to Detroit

New this year, and a first-time showing in Michigan, an exciting new boat called the Innespace Dolphin will be showcased at the Detroit Boat Show. It is a fully submersible watercraft designed to mimic the look and abilities of a real dolphin. It is able to perform many freestyle tricks including dives, jumps, and barrel rolls. It dives up to 5 feet and then when the snorkel is submerged, the engine's air supply is cut off and the engine will start to decelerate, causing the Dolphin to surface. The positively buoyant Dolphin always pops to the surface and self-rights. Watch it in action.

Casting Demos at the Hawg Tank!

Back by popular demand, the Hawg Tank will feature some of Michigan's most enticing game fish. This 45-foot, glass-sided semi trailer filled with water and natural environment offers a unique opportunity to see biting and fighting game fish in action.

The Boat Show will also have an exciting line-up of fishing seminars from top named pros from around the country.

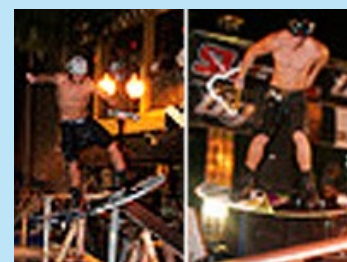

Despite Fuel Prices, Michigan Boaters Remain Passionate

A completed survey by the Recreational Marine Research Center (RMRC) at Michigan State University indicates that recent fuel price increases did influence both the amount and type of boating activity during the summer of 2004. However, it also revealed that high fuel prices don't affect the number of registered boaters in the state of Michigan.

More than 4,000 members of the RMRC's National Boater Panel completed a survey during late July and early August. Findings show 80% took a boat trip sometime between May and August on which they purchased fuel. 44% of boaters who purchased fuel for their boats during the summer did less boating because of higher fuel prices.

70% of these boaters took fewer boating trips. 53% reduced the length of their boating trips. 36% spent the most time on their boats at the dock. Boaters who purchased gasoline at marinas spent an average of \$262 for 107 gallons compared to an average purchase of \$56 for 28 gallons at gasoline stations. The average purchase of diesel fuel at marinas was \$184 for 90 gallons. Prices of gasoline vary across the country with the highest prices in California, Washington and Oregon, and the lowest in southern states.

"These survey results echo what I expected to see - which is a change in use patterns by boaters but not a decrease in the number of boaters," said Van Snider, President of the Michigan Boating Industries Association. "Boating is a passion, especially in Michigan, and higher gas prices might make you rethink the length of your trip, but it's not going to stop you from enjoying your boat. If it's important to you and your family, you'll find a way to cut back elsewhere or tweak your activities to adjust for higher gas prices."
